Their name translates roughly as "the peasants" (and was a popular term for the Cuban revolutionaries), but there's nothing commonplace about their sound, which has already won over fans of Belle and Sebastian and other smart-pop favorites.

Titus Andronicus, a raucous five-piece ensemble from New Jersey, crank it up to kick start the show.
